

Results of '98 Jamboree Logging Show

Scott Whitehead accumulated 20 points to take first place as All Around Logger in the 1998 Vernonia Jamboree Logging Show. The Tillamook logger trailed Kevin Hofenbredl going into the water events, then pulled ahead by winning the Pole Walk and placing second in the Boom Stick Run. Whitehead also placed first the Pole Walk & Snip, and took third in both Choker Setting and Steeple Chase.

Hofenbredl, of Grand Ronde, placed first in two events—Choker Setting and Working Saw 5-6 ci, second in the Steeple Chase and third in Working Saw 4-5 ci, for 17 points.

Matt Samuelson, Elsie, was third with 11 points.
