

PUBLIC NOTICE

NOXIOUS VEGETATION PUBLIC NOTICE

Between May 1st and September 30th of any year, no owner or person in charge of property shall allow noxious vegetation to be on the property or in the right of way of public thoroughfare abutting on the property. An owner or person in charge of property shall cut down or destroy grass, shrubbery, brush, bushes, weeds or other noxious vegetation as often as needed to prevent them from becoming unsightly, from becoming a fire hazard, or in the case of weeds or other noxious vegetation, from maturing or from going to seed.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The City is willing to abate the nuisance on a particular parcel of property at the request of the owner or person in charge of the property for a fee sufficient to cover the City's abatement costs. Even in the absence of such requests, the City may abate all such nuisances 10 or more days after publication of the 3rd Noxious Vegetation Public Notice and charge the cost of doing so on a particular parcel of property to the owner or the person in charge of the property, or the property itself.

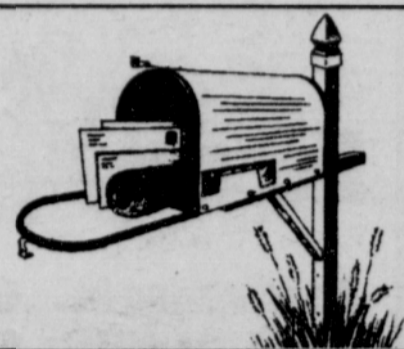
