1ST PUBLIC NOTICE

The City of Vernonia is eligible to apply for a 2000 Community Development Block Grant from the Oregon Economic and Community Development Department.

Community Development Block Grant funds come from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development. The grants can be used for public facilities, housing improvements, primarily for persons with low and moderate incomes.

Approximately \$15 million will be awarded to Oregon non-metropolitan cities and counties in 2000. The maximum grant that a city or county can receive is \$750,000.

The City of Vernonia is preparing an application for a 2000 Community Development Block Grant from the Oregon Economic and Community Development Department for a Technical Assistance Grant to explore the feasibility of building a new Senior Center in Vernonia. It is estimated that the proposed project will benefit at least 200 persons, all of whom will be low or moderate income.

The Vernonia City Council will hold a public hearing at 6:00 p.m. on September 18th,

2000 in the Council Chambers, Vernonia City Hall, 1001 Bridge Street, Vernonia, OR.

The purpose of this hearing is for the City Council to obtain citizen views and to respond to questions and comments about:

- Community development and housing needs, especially the needs of low and moderate income persons, as well as other needs in the community that might be assisted with a Community Development Block Grant project.
- The proposed project.

Written comments are also welcome and must be received by September 15th at Vernonia City Hall, 1001 Bridge Street, Vernonia OR 97064. Both oral and written comments will be considered by the City Council in deciding whether to apply.

Permanent involuntary displacement of persons or businesses is not anticipated as a result of the proposed project. If displacement becomes necessary, alternatives will be examined to minimize the displacement and provide required/reasonable benefits to those displaced. Any low and moderate income housing, which is demolished or converted to another use, will be replaced.

More information about Oregon Community Development Block Grants, the proposed project, and records about the City's past use of Community Development Block Grant funds is available for public review at Vernonia City Hall during regular office hours. Advance notice is requested.

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, November 7, 2000, A measure election will be held in Columbia County, Oregon.

The following shall be the ballot title of the measure to be submitted to the county's voters on this date:

5-67 CAPTION Four-Year Local Option Tax QUESTION

Shall Columbia County levy \$432,900.00 per year for four years beginning fiscal year 2001-2002 to fund the County Parks Department? This Measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

SUMMARY
The Columbia County Parks Department has relied on past proceeds from the harvest of County owned timber to operate the County's Parks Department. The Parks Department will likely experience budget shortfalls because no such timber harvests are scheduled in the next four years.

If approved, revenue would be used for the continued maintenance, operation, and improvement of County parks and marine facilities, including: day use and picnic facilities; walking trails; access trails; sports-

field renovation; replacement of rotting lodge roof, beams and foundation at Camp Wilkerson and Hudson Park.

If not approved, budget shortfalls may lead to a reduction in Park Department services including operations, maintenance and improvements; or the closure of certain facilities.

The cost of this measure to property taxpayers is estimated to be 15.9 cents per 1000.00 dollars of assessed value (\$15.90 per year for property valued at \$100,000.00) each year for four years. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of the estimate. The total amount of money to be raised under this measure is \$1,731,600.00 (\$432,000 each year for four years).

5-66 CAPTION Five-Year Local Option Tax

QUESTION
Shall Columbia County impose \$0.10/\$1,000 of assessed value for five years beginning in 2001-2002 for the County Fairgrounds? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

SUMMARY
The Columbia County Fair Board is responsible for the presentation of the annual Columbia County Fair and the management of the fairgrounds and buildings for the benefit of the many youths and adults who use the facilities throughout the year. Funds available to the Fair Board are no longer adequate to operate, repair and maintain the fairgrounds or make other necessary improvements.

The Columbia County Board of Commissioners, in consultation with the Fair Board, has agreed to present to the voters of Columbia County this Local Option Tax request.

The purpose of this tax is to raise funds necessary to operate, repair, maintain and otherwise improve the grounds and buildings currently located on the fairgrounds.

The estimated tax on a \$100,000 property would be \$10.00 per year for five years. The proposed rate will raise approximately \$289,641 in 2001-2002, \$295,549 in 2002-2003, \$304,416 in 2003-2004, \$313,548 in 2004-2005, and \$322,955 in 2005-2006, for a total of approximately \$1,526,109.
