False alarms could be expensive

Banks City Council last week reviewed an ordinance establishing policies to protect emergency services from misuse due to excessive false alarms. Nearly every business, the schools and many area homes have alarm systems that may require a police response, according to the City's police department. Banks School District Superintendent Marilyn McGlasson and the principals of the grade, junior high and high schools have reviewed and endorsed the ordinance.

The ordinance sets up a graduated system of fines that may be imposed if a false

alarm causes the police department to be called repeatedly to the same place. The ordinance would allow one false alarm annually at no charge to the user. The second time police respond and it is determined to be a false alarm, the person or business utilizing the alarm system will be charged \$25. In a step-wise fashion, fines increase up to \$100 for each incident of false alarm.

An appeal process is included in the proposed ordinance. Unpaid fines and court costs may become a lien against real property. An opportunity for public comment on the ordinance will soon be scheduled.

Child Care Basics class scheduled

Oregon Child Care Basics, a series of two classes designed to provide information that is helpful to child care professionals and parents, will be offered by Caring Options Child Care Resource & Referral.

A \$5 fee will be charged for each class to help defray the cost of materials. A limited number of scholarships are available, based on need, and will be awarded on a first come, first served basis. A free lunch is included. Pre-registration is required no later than 5 p.m., Thursday, September 21.

Morning sessions will include Health & Safety, Preventing Illness; Preparing, Handling and Storing Food; Problems and Causes of Childhood Injuries; How to Handle a Child's Medical Emergency; Toy Safety; Fire Prevention; Child Abuse; Children with Disabilities.

Afternoon sessions will include Social and Emotional Health, Self Esteem; Relationships; Guidance; Be Good to Yourself.
