1. The Columbia County 4-H and Extension Service District is requesting bids for the construction of an addition to and alteration of an existing office building located at 505 and 507 North Columbia River Highway, St. Helens, Oregon.

2. Bids will be accepted until 8:45 a.m., Tuesday, January 30, 2001. Cynthia Zemaitis, Legal Assistant, is the person designated for receipt of bids. Bids must be received by that time at the Office of County Counsel, Room 318, Columbia County Courthouse, St. Helens, Oregon, 97051. The bids must be in sealed envelopes marked "Bid for the 4-H and Extension Service District Office Project" or the equivalent. The bids will be publicly opened and read at 10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, January 30, 2001, in the Commissioners' Meeting Room, Room 308, Columbia County Courthouse, in St. Helens, Oregon.

3. This will be a contract for a public work

subject to ORS 279.348 to 279.380. No bid will be received or considered unless the bid contains a statement by the bidder as a part of its bid that the provisions of ORS 279.350 will be complied with.

4. Each bid must identify whether the bidder is a resident bidder as defined in ORS 279.029.

5. No bid shall be received or considered unless the bidder is registered with the Construction Contractors Board.

6. Bidders must be licensed under ORS 468A.720 (asbestos contractors).

7. The specifications, forms and bid documents may be examined at, and the Instructions to Bidders may be received from, the OSU Extension Service, Columbia County Courthouse, St. Helens, Oregon, 97051. Complete bid packets, construction drawings, and specifications are available from David E. Jensen, Architect, at 360-642-3507.

8. The County reserves the right to waive minor informalities in the bids received. The County may also reject any bid not in compliance with all prescribed public bidding procedures and requirements, and may reject for good cause any or all bids upon a finding by the County that it is in the

public interest to do so.

9. No bidder may withdraw a bid after the deadline set for receipt of bids unless thirty (30) days have elapsed and the County has not yet awarded the Contract.

projected for spring, 2001.

August 2000 brought notification of a \$249,000 grant from OPRD for the construction of restrooms with showers and a group picnic shelter for Anderson Park. A month earlier, Northwest Oregon Economic Alliance approved a grant of \$80,000 for construction of the infrastructure (water, sewer, electrical and phone) and paving for new RV hookup sites in Anderson Park. Through extensive planning by the Parks committee, the design for Anderson Park is complete.

The restroom facility will include two showers, three toilets and two sinks in the women's section and 2 show-

ers, two urinals and one toilet in the men's section. An ADA accessible/family shower will be located at the east end of the facility. A

Attached at the west end will be a small group, covered picnicking area with sinks and water fountain. The open 30'x44' large group picnicking area will be situated to the east of the restroom facility be constructed of pine with laminated beams, roof and picnic tables.

There will be 19 new, paved RV hookup sites with individual fire pits. Five of the RV sites will be ADA accessible. In order to provide for additional RV sites, the existing cook shack will be demolished.

The infrastructure is scheduled to be installed by Public Works in February 2001. Construction of the restroom facility, picnic shelter and paving of the RV sites are scheduled for April 2001, with a completion date of June 2001. Provisions have also been made for the purchase of new playground equipment. The playground will be relocated to the far west end of Anderson Park.
