Financial tools help families take control

A carefully developed financial plan helps you make sound decisions when buying a car or house, accumulating an emergency fund, or paying for education or retirement. The same is true when you experience major changes in your life, such as a new job, a pay raise, marriage, divorce or widowhood.

To develop a good financial plan, you first need to understand your current financial situation. Two tools come in handy when you want to review your family's current financial situation: the net worth statement and the income and expense statement.

A net worth statement is a picture of what you own and what you owe. It shows the fair market value of your assets--things you own--and your debts or liabilities--that is, money you owe others. The difference between assets and liabilities is your net worth.

An income and expense statement shows your income and how it was spent. Knowing income and expenses will help you adjust to financial changes. For example, what expenditures can and should be reduced or eliminated, when your income goes down? Conversely, what expenditures should increase when income goes up?

The OSU Extension Service has two brief publications that will help you prepare net worth and income and expense statements.

Single copies of "Preparing and Using an Income and Expense Statement," FS 330, and "Preparing and Using a Net Worth Statement," FS 331, are available at no charge from your local OSU Extension office.
