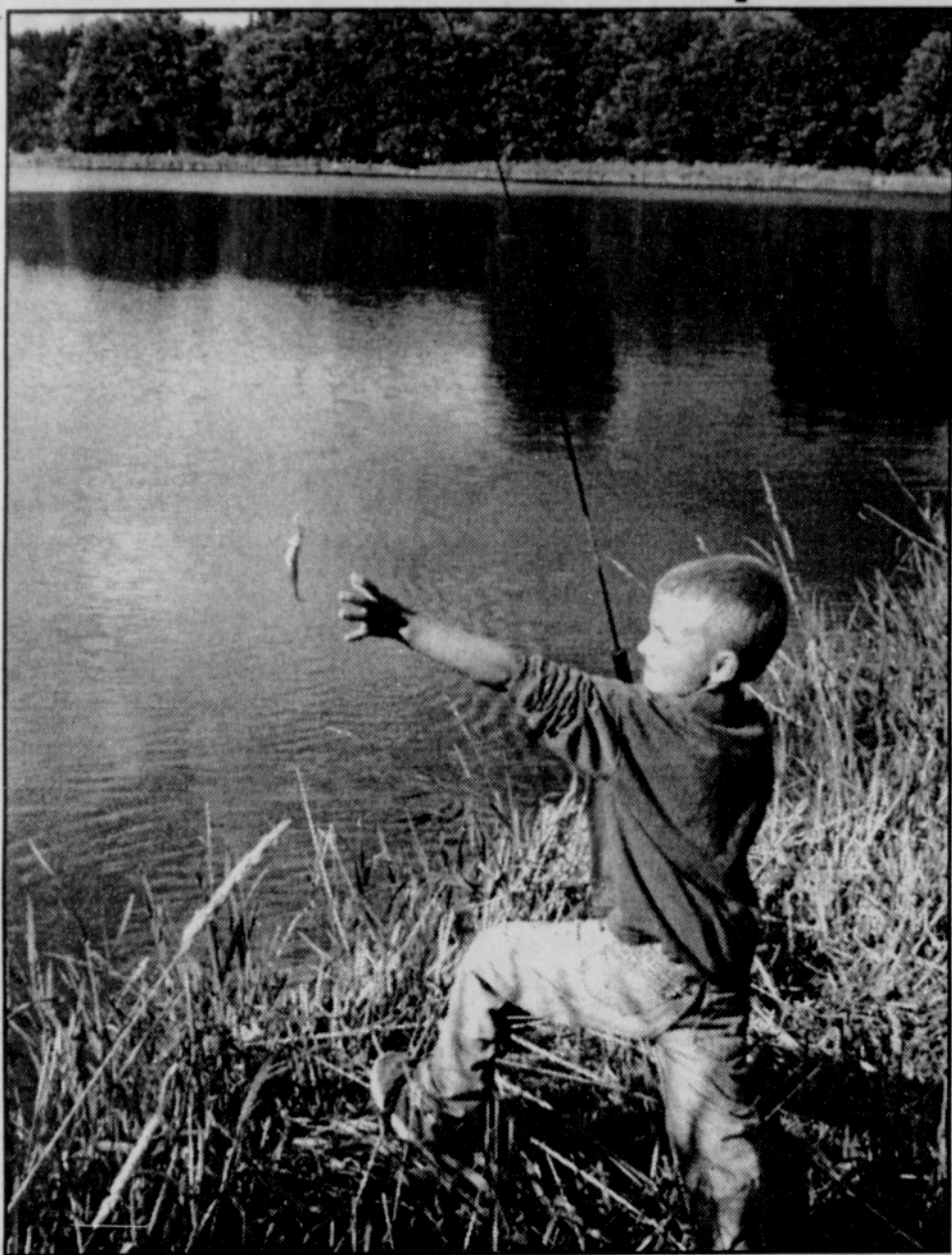


Jamboree events provide activities for nearly every interest
