Storm downs transmission line

Although two to three feet of snow fell in higher parts of the West Oregon Electric Cooperative service area from Jan. 26 to Jan. 28, the longest power outage occurred in the comparatively low-lying Chapman area.

Loss of the transmission line from Warren to the Chapman substation left about 500 Co-op members without power for eight or nine hours on Sunday, Jan. 27, reported WOEC General Manager Russell Green. Power was restored by midnight Sunday to most of the

area, with the remaining 25 to 50 members back on line by Monday noon.

Though mostly of brief duration, outages were widespread from Elsie to North Plains, with most of the trouble areas located north of the Sunset Highway in the hills around Green Mountain, Bacona and Banks, and toward Chapman. Throughout the system, crews worked around the clock until all service was restored, and had power to all but about 100 members by midnight Sunday.

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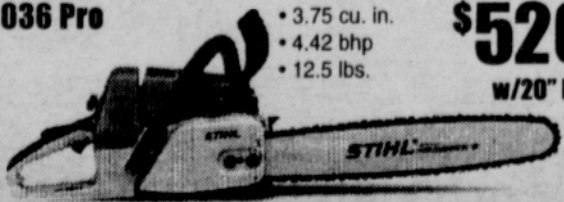
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
