RESOLUTION 6-01

FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF VERNONIA, OREGON

LET IT BE KNOWN TO ALL PERSONS of the City of Vernonia, Oregon that discrimination in the sale, rental, lease, financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage, rental services because of race, color, sex, disability (physical or mental), familial status (children) or national origin is prohibited by Title VIII of the federal Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988. It is the policy of the City of Vernonia to support the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 and to implement a Fair Housing Program to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, disability (physical and mental), familial status (children) or national origin. Therefore, the City does hereby pass the following Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED that within the resources available to the City through city, county, state, federal and community volunteer sources, the City will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, disability (physical and mental), familial status (children) or national origin in the process of filing a complaint with the Oregon Civil Rights Division or the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Seattle Regional Office Compliance Division, that they may seek equity under federal and state laws.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City shall publicize this Resolution and through this publicity shall cause real estate brokers and sellers, private home sellers, rental owners, rental property managers, real es-

tate and rental advertisers, leaders, builders, developers, home buyers and home or apartment renters to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 and any applicable state or local laws or ordinances.

THE FAIR HOUSING PROGRAM, for the purpose of informing those affected of their respective responsibilities and rights concerning Fair Housing law and complaint procedures, will, at a minimum, include, but not be limited to: 1) the printing, publicizing and distribution of this Resolution; 2) the distribution of posters, flyers, pamphlets and other applicable Fair Housing information provided by local, state and federal sources, through local media of community contracts; and 3) the publicizing of locations where assistance will be provided to those seeking to file a discrimination complaint.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption by City Council.

PUBLIC WORKSHOP MINE REGULATION PROGRAM WHO REGULATES, COUNTY OR STATE? COLUMBIA COUNTY COURTHOUSE CIRCUIT COURT ROOM 351

April 3, 2002 • 6:30 p.m.

A public workshop hosted by the Surface Mining Advisory Committee (SMAC) is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday April 3, 2002 in St. Helens at the County Courthouse in the third floor Circuit Court Room 351 to discuss the regulation of surface mining in Columbia County. Columbia County is the only county in the state that regulates surface mining. The Oregon Department of Geology and Mineral Industries (DOGAMI) regulates the remainder of the state. In response to concerns brought forward by both the mining industry and the public, the Board of Commissioners (BOC) retained a consultant, Kuper Consulting LLC, to compare and contrast the two mine regulatory programs. From this analysis, SMAC will make a recommendation to the BOC to either retain the regulatory program or to turn the program over to DOGAMI.

This is a general list of the differences between the two programs. The County will always retain the decision for siting a mine. The operational aspects can remain with the County or be transferred to DOGAMI.
