

## Banks planners look at graphics for fencing regs

The Banks Planning Commission met July 30 to consider illustrations that have been integrated into the new fencing ordinance, which the commission has been working on for several months. The planning commission will review the or-

dinance one more time, at their August meeting, then present it to city council in September.

Commissioners also heard a report from City Planner K.J. Won on the status of the periodic review. The city has received approval for a \$12,500

grant for planning services. The total amount will be paid over the two-year period required to complete the periodic review.

In other business the commission:

- Heard from Won that the planning department is allowed to make minor revisions to site plans and that Washington County had ruled that the proposed greenhouse project at Banks Elementary School would be considered a minor revision of the existing approved plan, as long as there are less than 120 square feet in each greenhouse.
