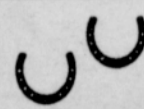

Composters really do help reduce waste

To the Editor:

As part of Columbia County's waste reduction effort, we attempt to provide more than just "handing out brochures" and try to encourage residents to be proactive in reducing the amount of materi-

al they dispose of. On that note, I would like to give a sincere thank you to the residents who purchased home compost bins from Columbia County. We sold a generous 150 bins to local residents. That means almost 477,000 pounds of organic debris will be home composted and diverted from our local landfill, based on the average family producing about 3,180 pounds of organic garbage per year. The composting bins play an important role in reducing the amount of organic waste going to our landfills. The home composting effort is invaluable in promoting waste reduction and, more importantly, instilling the value and need for waste reduction among our local residents.

Thank you again, Columbia County Residents, for your participation.
