Stuff to do now (beside staying warm and dry):

- Rake and destroy leaves from diseased fruit trees.
- · Plant, or move, landscape trees and shrubs.
- Trim chrysanthemums to 4-6 inches after blooming.
- · Clean and oil tools for winter storage.
- Force bulbs for indoor blooms.
- Apply lime.
- · BAIT for slugs, bait for slugs and bait for slugs!.
