

Vernonia area CPAC election set

Columbia County will be holding Citizen Planning Advisory Committee (CPAC) elections for positions whose term is expiring.

CPACs provide advice and recommendations to the County Land Use Planning entities, including the Planning Department, the Planning Commission and the Board of County Commissioners. CPAC members serve for two-year terms.

Each CPAC is divided into neighborhoods, with members representing the neighborhoods where they live or own property. Residents and/or property owners within the neighborhoods elect their CPAC members. There must be at least five voters from each neighborhood to hold an election. Eligibility to vote in your neighborhood requires either picture identification with your address, or a tax statement proving you own property within the neighborhood. You may only vote once in your

CPAC area.

The second CPAC election for the Vernonia area will be Tuesday, April 13, at 7:00 p.m. at Vernonia City Hall.

Other second elections will take place in Clatskanie and Rainier in April. For more information contact Glen Higgins or Jim Holycross at 503-397-1501.

Last Lewis & Clark Bridge panel placed

The last of 103 concrete deck panels was lowered into place on the Lewis and Clark Bridge during the night time closure on March 24, marking the start of the final phase of construction, according to the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT). The entire project is on sched-

ule for completion by June 1, seven months earlier than originally estimated.

"It's wonderful to see the Lewis and Clark Bridge deck replacement project progressing so quickly towards completion," said WSDOT Assistant Secretary John Conrad. "This project presented us with a lot of unique challenges that were successfully addressed using highly innovative construction techniques, which ultimately saved the state both time and money."

During the last few months of construction, project contractor Max J. Kune Company, will concentrate on finishing the new bridge deck, smoothing joints between the deck panels, completing roadway widening on both sides of the bridge and installing new lighting poles.

Remaining traffic impacts on the bridge will be:

Two weather-dependent full weekend closures, April 16-19

and April 23-26. If rain is forecast for either of these closures, it will be rescheduled. These closures will be used to install 1,575 feet of concrete paving. The Wahkiakum County/Puget Island ferry will be available free of charge during both weekends, and the emergency medical helicopter will be standing by on the Oregon side of the bridge.

Additional full nighttime closures also will be required to complete remaining work. Five full closures are tentatively scheduled for the nights of April 4-7 and 15. Night-time single-lane closures will be used to complete most of the final work. Until the project is completed, intermittent slowdowns will continue and motorists should expect brief traffic delays.
