OSU Extension to hold class about log grading and scaling

Log grading and scaling will be the topics of an upcoming two-part class offered by the OSU Extension Service in St. Helens. The featured speakers include Mark Dryer, log buyer with Stimson Lumber, Mike Ross, area manager with the Yamhill Log Scaling Bureau and OSU Extension forester Chal Landgren.

The first class will be held November 10 from 6:30 to 9:00 p.m. at the Columbia County OSU Extension office, 505 N. Columbia River Highway in St. Helens. Topics will include background on log scaling and grading and information helpful in determining if your Douglasfir logs will be no. 2 sawmill grade, no. 3, or "fast growth." Discussion will include how deductions in grade are determined and how log grades influence the price paid for trees.

The second class will be Saturday, November 13 from 8:30 a.m. to noon. After meeting briefly at the OSU Extension office, the group will go to the Stimson Lumber log yard, where they will look at logs brought in to the mill and consider log values and types of defects and deductions that are common in Douglas-fir logs.

Dec. 10 cut-off date for EQIP funding

Applications for the 2005 Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) will be accepted until Dec. 10 for 2005 funding. Applications received after that date will be deferred for consideration in 2006.

EQIP is a voluntary conservation program offered through the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service that provides eligible agricultural operations cost share and incentive payments for installing conservation practices that improve natural resource problems.

In Columbia County natural resource priorities include water quality concerns from live-

stock operations, wildlife habitat concerns, soil quality concerns and others. Some conservation practices that have previously been implemented with EQIP include fencing of sensitive areas such as creeks and wetlands, stream improvements, manure storage facilities, pasture improvements and nutrient management.
