The only incumbent not replaced was Cari Levenseller, who had no opponent.

Two vacant positions went to Dick Brunsman, who outpolled Leslie Barnes 458 to 200, and Angela Taylor, who was unopposed.

Banks School District

Incumbents Doug Nordholm and Angi Duyck were re-elected without opposition.

Will Moore received 430 votes to take the third position over Ruth Liesegang, with 233.

Jewell School District

Teri Greenwood retained her position with 121 votes to challenger Carolyn Eady's 77.

Ann Samuelson was elected

to fill the seat vacated by her husband, defeating Bonnie Uerling 116 to 76.

Portland CC District

Jim Harper coasted to a win in a three-way race for an open position, defeating George Hendrix and Richard La Mountain.

Incumbent Doreen Margolin won re-election over David Squire.

Clatsop CC District

Incumbents Karen Mellin, Frank Satterwhite, Rosemary Baker-Monaghan, and Doug Grant were re-elected without opponents.

Bill DeJager, Trish Wright and Troy Horton.

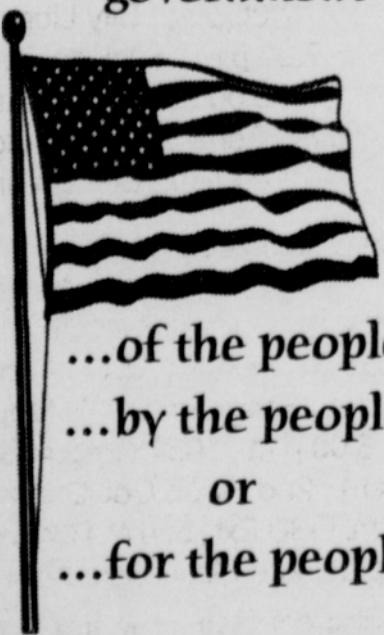
Banks Fire District

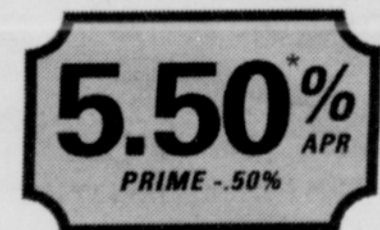
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
