Bassett told council that a proposal to replace the Mile Bridge (commonly known as the green steel bridge) was designated as the number two project by the Northwest Area Commission on Transportation (NWACT). Included in the proposal's information is that the bridge was built in 1938 and the lead-based paint on the bridge is deteriorating (Bassett said

"it's falling into the river."). Additionally, both the turning radius onto the bridge and the lane width are safety issues. Bassett said she is confident that, if this proposal doesn't generate the funds needed to replace the bridge, funding from the Department of Transportation will be found.

State Dems affirm support of 2nd Amend.

The Democratic Party of Oregon, at their quarterly meeting in Medford, passed a resolution unconditionally reaffirming the right to keep and bear arms in accordance with the Second Amendment of the U.S. Constitution, and of Article 1, Section 27, of the Oregon State Constitution.

The right to bear arms is "an individual right not granted by the government, but rather guaranteed by the government" the resolution states. It also advocates severe penalties for criminal use or misuse of that right.

The resolution was passed to clarify the stance of the Democratic Party of Oregon re-
