

Detailing her frustrations and bitterness after 16 years in the district, Titus had many complaints about staffing decisions and charged that "tests were watered down to make the district appear to comply" with No Child Left Behind standards. #### **Board Workshop**

The meeting began with a workshop presented by Oregon School Board Association (OSBA) representative Greg McKenzie concerning board roles and responsibilities. Though the board engaged in lively discussion throughout the workshop, new board member Kim Wallace expressed disappointment, after the meeting, that some procedures – such as the appropriate way to respond to public comment – had not been covered.

# Park & Rec grant will help City buy mill site property

The City of Vernonia has been awarded a grant of \$285,000 from Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) to purchase property at the old mill site. The Vernonia grant is part of more than \$5 million OPRD is awarding to help buy, develop and improve parklands and outdoor recreation facilities in Oregon communities ranging in size from Adams (pop. 320) in northeast Oregon to the Portland metropolitan area.

The lottery-funded "Local Government Grants," will help finance 22 large projects ranging in cost from \$54,952 to \$500,000, and 15 small projects costing from \$15,000 to \$50,000. The grants were recommended by OPRD's Local Government Advisory Committee and approved by the Oregon Parks and Recreation Commission based on criteria that included recreation needs

and planning, the formation of partnerships, public support, timeliness, sustainability and the availability of other funding sources.

# Hwy. 47 closed this weekend to replace culvert

The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) will be replacing a culvert on Hwy. 47 with one that will allow fish passage. The culvert is located at milepost 67.36, on Hwy. 47, approximately 10 miles north of U.S. 26 and five miles south of Vernonia (one mile north of McDonald Road). During the culvert replacement, Hwy 47 will be closed at milepost 67.36 from 10:00 p.m. Friday, August 19 through 5:00 a.m. Monday, August 22. Through traffic on Hwy 47 will be directed to use

## Vernonia man, friend die in plane crash

Matthew Giles, 32, of Vernonia, and Gary Harkins, 39, of Columbia City, died August 5 when their plane crashed just south of Cavanaugh Bay Airstrip, at the southern end of Priest Lake, near Coolin, Idaho.

Giles was piloting an RV4 experimental aircraft from Scappoose to Idaho, when, according to witnesses on the ground, the plane suddenly dove straight down, about 100 to 200 yards from the airstrip.

Atmospheric conditions may have contributed to the accident.

Mr. Giles is survived by his wife, Heather, daughter, Mac-Kenzie, and an unborn child.
