Tillamook Forest Center now open

The new Tillamook Forest Center visitor and educational facility opened its doors for the first time Saturday, April 1, on the first day of Oregon Arbor Week. This will be visitors' first chance to enjoy the Center's 40-foot tall replica of a fire lookout tower and walk across the dramatic 250-foot-long pedestrian suspension bridge across the Wilson River.

Center visitors can also explore the past, present and future of the Tillamook State Forest through artifacts, personal stories, photos, film, exhibits, games, hands-on models, computer simulations, interpreter-led programs and other innovative media. Outdoors, the forest comes alive through salmon watching viewpoints and a network of interpretive trails.

Admission to the Center is free. During the winter off-season (October – April), the Center is open from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Wednesday – Sunday (closed Monday and Tuesday). During summer months (May – September) it will be open seven days a week from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

The Tillamook Forest Center, located in a stand of trees planted by schoolchildren in the 1950s, is 50 miles west of Portland on the Wilson River Highway (Oregon 6) in the heart of the former "Tillamook Burn," which is today's Tillamook State Forest.
