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the coast. If a fishery is allowed, it will be a short affair at best.

So how did we get into this situation? You may remember back a few years, when the water wars were raging in the Klamath basin and the final outcome was that the farmers ended up getting their water. Well, being that the water was in short supply, something had to give and that was the salmon.

When they returned in the early fall, they died by the thousands, due to poor water quality, a direct relationship to the lack of adequate flows. It is not only the Klamath waters that are needed, but also water from the Trinity River, which drains into the Klamath River, except that it is being piped farther south to provide water to farms and people.

So the salmon died, and now the returning numbers are

so low that any incidental ocean harvest will be unacceptable. The impact will be measured in the millions of dollars. Now you can see that the water used in the Klamath basin, was not free after all.
