have work done: 1. Make sure the contractor is licensed with the CCB. Before hiring a contractor, check the contractor's license and complaint history at the new website or 503-378-4621. Take time to make an informed decision. You wouldn't trust an unlicensed driver with your car. Don't give the keys to your most precious investment to an unlicensed contractor.

Licensing is required for those who offer painting, roofing, carpentry, siding, plumbing, electrical, floor covering, concrete, asphalt, window, insulation, manufactured dwelling installation, inspection services, heating and air conditioning, and most other construction and repair services.

2. Use a written contract. Put all agreements, and changes, in writing. Generally, the more detailed a contract, the fewer problems that occur later. A big project needs more than a vague contract: "Remodel master bedroom, \$19,500" is simply

not sufficient. Know what your contract does, and does not cover. Don't sign unless you understand everything.

3. Get more than one bid, but don't automatically accept the lowest bid. The old saying, "you get what you pay for" applies to construction projects. A higher bid may be worth the price in better materials, workmanship and reliability.

A large number of CCB complaints result from homeowners accepting an unrealistically low bid and then being unhappy with the low quality of work.

- 4. Communicate. Asking lots questions before the job starts helps prevent problems later. Talk to your contractor throughout the project. Most disputes happen because people fail to communicate at every step.
- 5. Check references. Learn as much as you can about the contractor you are hiring.

But ultimately, the owner is responsible for making sure the reguired permits are obtained. Failing to get building permits doesn't save you money - it can cost you your safety and
