communities," said Steve Sallé, St. Helens Police chief.

The Oregon State Hazardous Materials Response Team will lead the demonstrations, at 11:00 a.m., with all their elaborate equipment and well-trained personnel. At noon, a Life Flight helicopter will land, allowing attendees to visit with the crew and look inside. Other demonstrations will include a look at law enforcement tactical teams, boating safety tips, a bigger than ever fire suppres-

sion event and a decontamination exercise. The ever popular police dogs and taser demonstrations will continue to thrill the crowds. The American Red Cross will show off its feeding van and other response rigs while handing out cool beverages and snacks. Oregon State Police Sgt. Larry Lucas has arranged for fairgoers to see and sit in the new unmarked OSP Aggressive Driving Enforcement Plan (ADEP) Dodge Charger. The U.S. Coast Guard has tentatively agreed to

demonstrate their response to an oil spill.

Matt Workman, Vernonia's Chief of Police, noted that "This event gives our citizens a chance to see our well equipped and trained emergency responders."

Coloring contest forms are available for children through age 12 at various grocery stores located throughout the County. Kids should bring the completed entry form to the CEPA Expo booth and claim a prize. There will also be a drawing at the end of the day for

some bigger prizes, including a new bike. Participants need not be present to win. Admittance to the EXPO is included in your ticket to the Columbia County Fair.

ty program (ACP) that is coordinated through the Oregon Department of Justice (DOJ). This unique program allows eligible victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking to keep their residence address confidential by using a substitute ACP address that receives 1st class certified and registered mail. It also allows participants to use the ACP P.O. Box on their driver's license or ID card. This program offers eligible victims an extra sense of

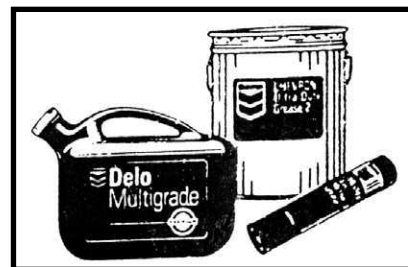
