Public Notice Re: Election Initiative

Caption: Measure Dealing with Employment of Undocumented Workers by Building Contractors.

Question: Shall Columbia County penalize contractors found to employ undocumented workers and require all contractors to post signs at job sites?

Statement: This measure would require Columbia County to order all contractors to post every job site in the county with a sign saying "Legal Workers Only." The sign must contain the following information:

- That a "punitive charge" of \$15,000 would be added to the cost of a construction permit if any undocumented workers were found to have worked on the site.

LEGAL NOTICE

• That a "stop work order" would go into effect until:

1. The punitive charge was paid; and

2. All undocumented workers were removed from the site.

• Telephone numbers of the Building Department, Sheriff's Office, and Social Security verification pilot project would also be part of the sign.

• Specifications of the sign would be 4 foot by 8 foot three-quarter inch plywood with words in minimum five inch bold print.

In accordance with ORS 250.168 (2), the proposed initiative meets the requirements of Section 1 (2)(d), Article IV, and Section 10 Article VI of the Oregon Constitution.
