Boredom can lead to ideas of filling free time with the right parental encouragement.

a job well done. Think "healthy" when selecting rewards. Staying up an extra hour, a trip to the library, going fishing, or enrolling in summer camp are a few ideas.
Setting limits on TV and watching responsibly will help protect your child and teen from many influences that are not in the best interest for them and overall your family. It is worth the time to have these discussions with your children.

The Civil Rights Division of the Bureau of Labor and Industries enforces laws granting job seekers and employees equal access to jobs, career schools, promotions, and a work environment free from discrimination or harassment. These laws ensure workers job protection when they report worksite safe-

ty violations, use family leave provisions or file for workers' compensation. Civil rights laws also provide protection for those seeking housing or using public facilities. The Division fields an average of 30,000 inquiries annually and investigates approximately 2,000-2,500 cases per year.
