Muscle strengthening equip-

- resistance bands: for leg, arm, and back strengthening exercises
- free weights: work arms, back, chest, and shoulder mus-
- ankle weights: use during exercises to strengthen leg and hip muscles

Flexibility equipment

- stability ball: for abdominal strength and back stretches
- exercise mat: for floor stretches and crunches

- resistance bands: to help hold stretches

Problem: It's hard to get **motivate**d

Solution: It can be difficult to start a workout once vou are comfortably reading the newspaper or busy with a household project. So, plan to exercise before or in between other activities. Remember, this is your workout-your way to burn some calories, do your heart some good, and get energized.

Problem: You don't like your family watching you ex-

Solution: Find a private space if possible. Otherwise,

adjust your schedule to exercise when you're alone. Or close the doors and make the room you're in off-limits for a short time. (Don't worry—they'll aet used to it.)

Problem: You don't know what exercises to do

Solution: There are thousands of exercise videos on the market that will guide you in short or long workouts. Try yoga, Pilates, kickboxing, or muscle toning videos. Lots of simple exercise equipment comes with instructions for different workouts. You can also find exercise ideas on the Internet. Or you can even hire a personal trainer to develop one or two short at-home workouts for vou.

For the simplest, least expensive workout simply turn on some music and dance. Add some marching in place, throw in some jumping jacks, high kicks, knee lifts, squats, sit-ups, push-ups, leg lifts, arm circles, and any other exercises you
