Bringman to ride bulls in nationals

Jake Bringman, who will be a sophomore this year at Vernonia High School, has been riding bulls for only two years and has done very well in his short career. His first year, 2008, he was the Junior Bull Riding Champion for the Northwest Youth Rodeo Association (NYRA). This year, he rode bulls for both NYRA and the Oregon Junior Bull Riders Association (OJBRA), and qualified to go to the national competition.

"I like being with my friends that I only get to see at the rodeos. It's like having a huge extended family. And I love riding bulls," said Bringman about bull riding and the time he's spent the last two summers at area rodeos.

In the sport of Bull Riding, the goal is to stay on the bull for 6 seconds (for the junior division) while holding on with only one hand to a loose rope. Judges mark the rider and the bull using a system of zero to 25 points. No knots or hitches can be used in the rope and no sharp spurs are allowed. By the way, bulls can weigh up to a ton and will try to hook or flip the rider, or mash the rider into the fence. Bulls also have a tendency to come back and stomp on a fallen rider, if they can.

Bringman will be representing Oregon in the Junior Division of the bull riding championships to be held in Shawnee, Oklahoma, in November. Bringman wanted to thank his sponsors and Rusty and Lisa Gorham for all the time they put into running OJBRA.

cludes nutrition, education, medical and dental services for the enrolled child, and home visitations. USDA approved meals are served. Limited transportation may be available.


