District 1: Bernard Bird (incumbent) 154 votes, Brian Baker 222 votes.


District 4: Joe Riley (incumbent) ran unopposed.

# OSP asks for help with illegal elk kill

The Oregon State Police (OSP) is asking the public to help identify the person(s) responsible for the illegal take and waste of a Cow Elk during closed season about four miles north of Tillamook, near Kilchis River Road and Barker's Bridge. A reward is offered for information leading to an arrest in this case.

OSP Fish and Wildlife Division troopers are investigating the incident that occurred prior to August 21. Investigation revealed the elk was killed along

Kilchis River Road, then dragged up a spur road, where portions of the meat were taken.

The Tillamook County Chapter of the Oregon Hunters Association, along with the Turn In Poacher (TIP) program, is offering up to a \$1,000 dollar reward for information leading to the arrest of a suspect or suspects. cut to 90 minutes, and has all new sound tracks, Etheridge said. If the local actors don't sound like themselves, it's because we won't hear their voices, he explained, though the change had nothing to do with the quality of the original voices.

In order to translate and market the film into foreign language prints, three new sound tracks were needed – music, sound effects, voices – because if the original voices are erased to dub the film in another language, the sound effects and music are also erased.

Voice over-dubbing, as the procedure is called, is a common practice, Etheridge said, though few people have heard of it. The film is currently available in English, Spanish and Korean.
