Do you have your I.S. permit? What the heck is an I.S. permit you say? Invasive Species! We are being invaded by

aquatic species. Starting January 1st, if you own a boat greater than 10 feet in length, you will be required to purchase a permit to use your boat in Oregon waterways. The odd thing is that the permit is issued to the individual boater, not the boat for manual powered craft,

so, in a drift boat only one person aboard must have the permit. Kayakers will have to have the \$7 annual permit, while registered power boaters will have the \$5 dollar fee rolled into their bi-annual fee. It would be best to go to the Oregon Marine Board website and review the

new law and all the fine points, because it will be easy for somebody to mess up and get a \$152 fine. I really like my Perception Phat kayak, it is only 9'6" long! Frankly this is a very odd new law and was a last minute legislative bill that got shoved through and put

onto the Marine Board to administer. Frankly I think the legislature should do a redo!

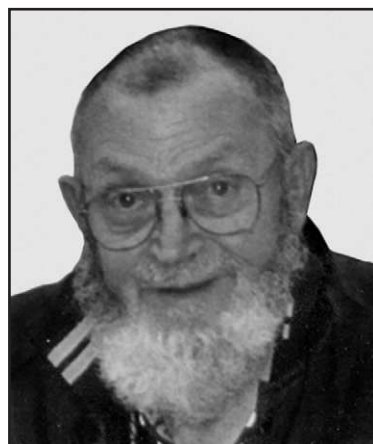

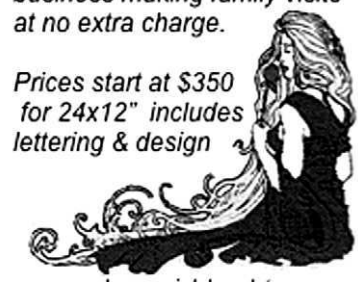
