Council tables sign ordinance for further study

The February 16 Vernonia City Council meeting started with council choosing Randy Parrow to act as Council President for 2010. It was also announced that two councilor positions, plus the mayor's position, will be up for a vote in November.

Bob City Administrator told that Young council changes to the proposed new sign ordinance will be held until after staff has reviewed the ordinance more and Paul Koch gives his Main Street presentation. City Attorney Jeff Bennett added that the sign ordinance is part of land use and, as such, is regulated by state land use rules, whivh require that criteria must be included for ways to appeal decisions made under the ordinance.

Mayor Sally Harrison added that, as part of the Main Street project, there will by Town Halls held for the public.
