Local businesses form Downtown Association

A meeting of downtown business owners and Paul Koch, a downtown revitalization consultant, was held by the City of Vernonia on March 9. The Vernonia City Council has asked the State of Oregon to make Vernonia a Main Street Program city.

At the meeting, business owners were asked to decide whether the Main Street Program or another model would work best for the city. Those attending requested time to review the documentation presented and another meeting was set for March 28.

Thirteen downtown business owners or downtown property owners decided at the March 28 meeting to form a Downtown Association to work as a subcommittee of the city's Economic Development Committee. The Association decided to wait until the city complete's the vision process they have begun, before deciding on further direction.

The city held a work session, March 22, with members of the Planning Commission and City Council to work on the wording of their 20 year Vision statement, Mission statement and Strategic Plan. The city then held a community meeting on March 29 to get citizen input into the process. With 22 people in attendance at the March 29 meeting, drafts of the Vision and Mission statements, and a list of Strategic Initiatives and Proposed Values was reviewed. A final draft will be presented and discussed at the April 5 Vernonia City Council meeting, with approval of the final draft expected at their April 19 meeting.

In the meantime, the newly formed Downtown Association chairman, Marilyn Nicks, met last week with a representative of the Main Street Program to

gather information for the Association. The next meeting of the Association has not yet been scheduled and may not be set until the council finishes their Vision statement.

County jobless rate shows improvement

Columbia County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 11.3 percent in February, a significant decrease from the previous month (12.0%) and lower than the year before (12.0%). The rate was above the statewide rate (10.5%) and the national rate (9.7%). Total employment climbed by 155 to 21,254 and the number of unemployed people fell by 83 to 3,189. Total employment this February was 388 fewer than one year before but there were 265 fewer people unemployed this year.

and \$11.7 million in shares. This growth is a result of members utilizing the Credit Union to satisfy more of their financial needs. Wauna recorded a net loss for 2009 of \$9,624. This was a result of expensing \$784,008 to support the credit union industry, instead of the industry using taxpayer money. All credit unions participated in supporting its industry rather than using taxpayer's money. Without this expense, which did not arise from Wauna's activity, the Credit Union would have shown a net income of \$774,384 compared \$660,167 for 2008.

Member shares at our credit union are insured by the NCUA (National Credit Union Association) for up to \$250,000 as part of the Economic Stabilization Statute. According to the NCUA website, not one penny of insured savings has been lost by See Wauna on page 10
