## 47J Board starts 2010/11 budget process

The May 13 meeting of the Vernonia School Board started with the district's first budget meeting. The proposed budget was distributed to budget committee members, along with the budget message prepared by Superintendent Dr. Ken Cox.

The budget message outlines a budget for the district that is based on revenue of \$6,043,896, or three percent more than last year, but 10.5 percent below the year before. The district made significant cuts in last year's budget, so this year's budget did not require significant changes. It also includes one more student contact day than this year.

Contingency funds that would usually be held at five percent of the total were cut to 4.5 percent in order to avoid further staff cuts. "The budget does not meet all of the current needs of the students and staff in the district but it does fulfill our fiscal responsibility to the patrons of the Vernonia School District," Cox stated near the end of his budget message.

The next budget meeting will

be held May 27, at 6:00 p.m., in the district office. Budget meetings are open to the public.

After the budget portion of the meeting, grade school principal Aaron Miller thanked the Vernonia Lions Club for bringing their hearing and vision screening bus to Vernonia this week so all first, third, and fifth graders could have free screenings, in addition to students in other grades who were referred for screening.

The board, with regret and thanks for her service, accepted the resignation of board member Tammy Jennings. The Jennings' are moving out of the district over the summer. The district is now accepting applications for this board position. The position will be filled for the remainder of Jennings term, one year, then will be filled by election. Applications are available at the district office and the board hopes to interview prospective members at their July 8 meeting.

A \$15,000 transfer into the Food Service budget was approved to cover projected expenses for the rest of the school year. During the discussion on this agenda item, it was mentioned that anyone can buy lunch at the school for less than \$4 per day. Check in at the office in the green building, pay for your lunch and join the students. There is usually an empty table or two and Cox recommends the salad bar, in particular, as having many selections from which to choose.



If you have suggestions or ideas on what you would like to see different in our schools, now is the time to share them with us. Not only for budgetary purposes, but also as we come to the close of another school year and will be doing an overall evaluation of how we are doing and what we can do next year to be better.
