## Harrison rescinds withdrawal, council okays \$1800 for K9 car upgrade

The Vernonia City Council meeting of October 4 ended with Mayor Sally Harrison reading an "Open Letter to Vernonia" in which she said, "...but I've finally made up my mind to withdraw my candidacy for Mayor." The reasons cited were a recent surgery, a broken ankle, her husband's health (her husband, Del Harrison, died later that night), and her home's elevation project.

Less than 24 hours later, she was back in the race.

On October 6, she told The Independent, "Yesterday, I received about 2,000 calls asking me to run, there seems to be a groundswell of support for me."

Extra expenditures listed on

the new "Funds Verification Request" forms and approved at the September 20 and October 4 meetings included \$1,829.20 to upgrade the K-9 car equipment to automatically roll down the windows if it gets too hot in

the car, with "two independent temperature probes for built-in redundancy." The other request approved was \$3,000 for a level signal in the city water reservoir so a Public Works employee doesn't have to go to the reservoir every day to manually check the water level. Council approved this request conditionally, based on the existing phone line being able to handle the signal.

Intergovernmental Three Agreements (IGAs) were presented to council for approval with minor changes from IGAs they approved in April. Those and a new IGA were all between the city and the school district, and dealt with the landswap of Spencer Park, wetlands replacement and transfer of the existing school property to the city.

Councilors asked questions about the existing IGAs that Pro-Tem City Administrator Bill Haack said surprised him, as the questions referred to existing (not changed) language that the same council had approved in April. Council approved all four IGAs after some further discussion. Council also approved the second reading of Ordinances 868 and 869, which deal with zoning of the new schools site.

Josette Mitchell, from the Ad

Hoc Budget Committee, reported to council on the 1st quarter budget. Since a quarter of the budget year is over, she reported on any budget items that were beyond 25 percent of the budgeted line item. Some variances were due to timing issues, such as the Library equipment fund, which is over 100 percent of the year's expenditure, but is for a one-time computer virus protection program. Other areas that Mitchell identified as being problems were the city hall electricity and the city hall fire alarm contract, both will go over budget by the end of the fiscal year. At the end of the presentation, council directed Haack to work with Public Works on the Ad Hoc recommendations regarding projects to be completed.

Council approved motions suggested by the Public Works Committee to use funds from the existing sewer loan to move toward hiring a company to design the waste water treatment plant.

In other business, council;

- approved Resolution 32-10 which states city support of affordable housing opportunities for persons with low, middle or fixed incomes. This resolution is necessary in order for the city to accept Community Development Block Grant funds for projects within Vernonia.
- · approved a request to declare a Public Works vehicle, the Jeep Cherokee SE Sport

utility, as surplus so it can be sold.

· was told to expect to interview for a new city attorney at one of the next two council meetings.

The next council meeting will be October 18, at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall.

## County employment numbers unchanged

Columbia County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 11.7 percent in August, the same as the previous month but lower than the year before (13.7%). The rate was above the statewide rate (10.6%) and the national rate (9.6%). Total employment rose by 236 to 21,817 and the number of unemployed people fell by 69 to 2,781. Total employment this August was 323 more than one year before and
