Eventually you can utter the immortal words of Alfred E. Neuman, "What, me worry?"

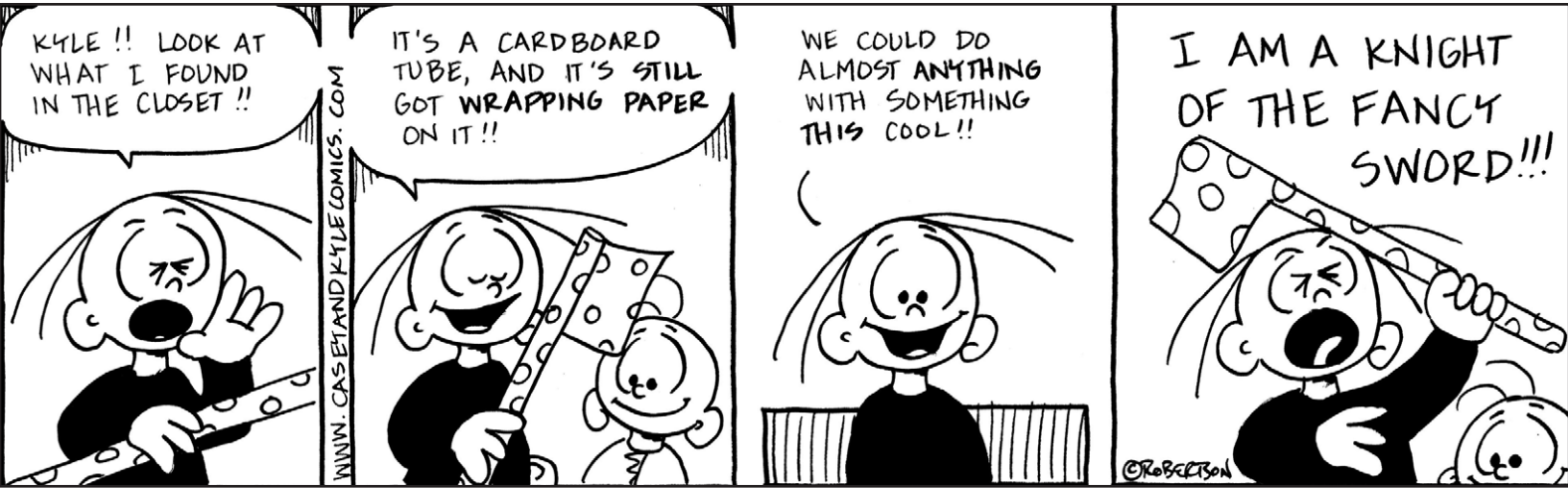
Council declares vehicles surplus

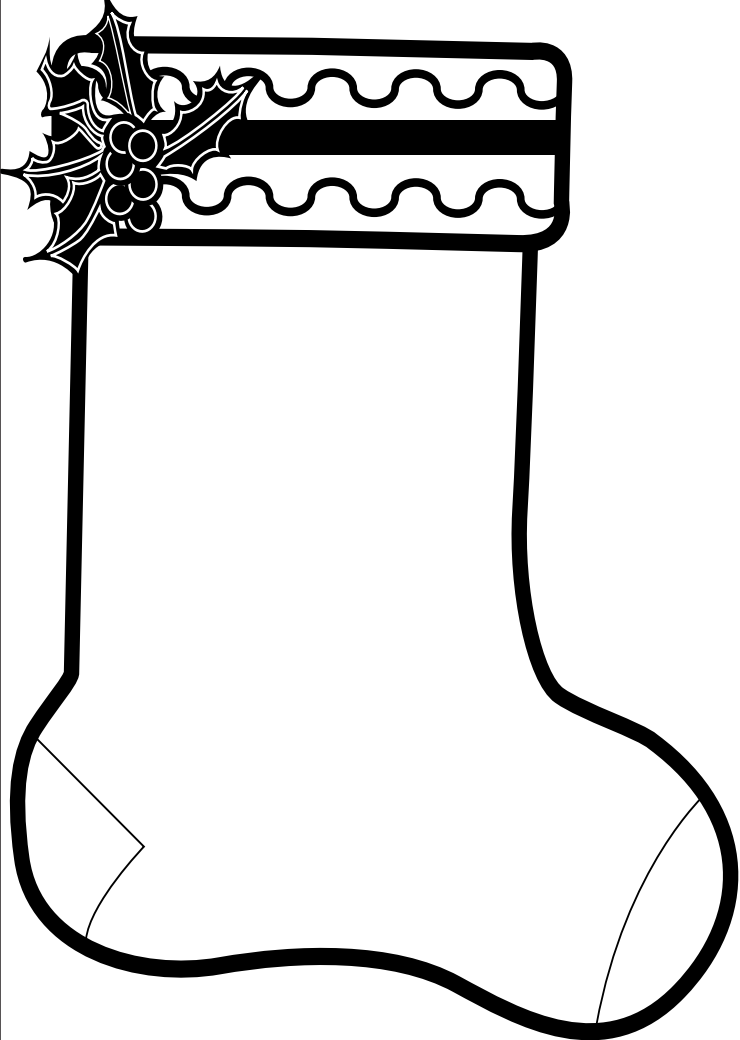
