On the Shelf:

The Pink Panther: The Ultimate Collection of Films and Cartoons. If you are a fan of Peter Sellers, Inspector Clouseau, and the Pink Panther, we have got a treat for you. We recently received a collection that contains all of the Pink Panther movies, plus all of the Pink Panther cartoons, plus all of The Inspector Cartoon Collection. Each DVD is being entered by itself, so you can work your way through the collection at a leisurely pace and pick and chose the ones you want to see.

The Thousand Autumns of Jacob De Zoet by David Mitchell. This historical novel is set in a time and place not often found in fiction: 1799 in Dejima in Nagasaki Harbor, Japan. Dejima was the Japanese Empire's only contact with the world, designed to keep the West at bay. It is also the farthest outpost of the war-ravaged Dutch East Indies Company and a virtual prison for the foreigners permitted to work there. Jacob de Zoet arrives into this time and place with the intention of making a fortune and returning to Holland to win the hand of his fiancée. He encounters scoundrels and courtesans and finds himself drawn to the daughter of a samurai doctor. The novel is intense and complex, but contains enough action to be an exciting read.

Chick Days, Raising Chickens from Hatchlings to Laying Hens by Jenna Woginrich. If you've been contemplating getting chickens, this is a fun book to get you started. Unlike more traditional books on raising poultry, this book is designed for the family that wants to have just a few birds in their backyard. Charming pictures illustrate the growth of a chick into a hen and an informative, month-by-month layout makes the information you need readily accessible. This book is shelved with the adult books, but it will appeal to the whole family.

The National Parks, America's Best Idea. We have both the book and the 6-disc DVD collection. This film by Ken Burns took nearly a decade to produce. It explores the uniquely

American idea of preserving the most precious portions of the land for everyone. The struggles and conflicts of the parks' formation are set against a backdrop of stunning beauty and grandeur. The companion book, by Dayton Duncan and Ken Burns, is beautifully illustrated with many historical photographs of the National Parks and the people who made them possible. It also includes maps, detailed information about the parks, and stories about people, events and places.
