Superintendent Brown emphasized that if you truly desire a position with the Oregon State Police it takes discipline and preparation. The best advice is to train to the highest possible level you can achieve, even if that surpasses the printed standards. During the physical abilities testing, applicants are required to meet specific standards for performing pushups and sit-ups in two minutes and running two miles under an allotted time.
