New health provider coming in February

The Vernonia Health Board has completed negotiations with Verdura Family Wellness, which will open their second location in the Vernonia Medical Clinic building that had been contracted to Providence Clinic. Providence's last day in the clinic was December 30.

The Verdura Family Wellness clinic, owned by Dr. Brian Miller, D.O., has operated in Hillsboro since 2004. Currently, in Hillsboro, Dr. Miller and two Physicians Assistants see patients four days a week. They take Medicare, Medicaid, most private insurance and private

pay patients.

The staff of Verdura Family Wellness will begin moving into the local clinic this month, with an expected opening in early February, after new staff is hired and trained (see their Help Wanted ad on page 18 of this issue).

More information will be available later in January about the new provider's hours, days of operation, etc.
