With time's inevitable march, those of us who are getting older know that summer will be here before we know it, and I am very much aware of how quickly it is approaching, with all that is being planned and must be done to move into our new schools this fall. In order to try to keep things straight I have prepared an online calendar that will help keep everyone informed and (hopefully) avoid too many conflicts. Here are some highlights of events that are being scheduled:

• Grand Opening Celebration – August 21 – we are currently

The actual move to the new school will take place in multiple phases beginning in mid-June through July 13. The deconstruction and demolition will begin in earnest the following week. We are going to be working with the contractor to make the salvage of some mementos from the buildings available. If you have a request, please let us know as soon as possible so that we can compile a list and make sure that we are in compliance with all the FEMA regulations (since they paid for the buildings to be removed).

Head Start, a federally funded pre-school program, is seeking students for the 2012-2013 school year. Applications are being taken from all three and four year olds in Columbia County for fall enrollment. Enrollment will be completed in August. If parents are interested in enrollment information they are urged to phone immediately.

Prospective students must be three or four years old by September 1, 2012. Children must be from limited income households, or have a disability and/or special needs to qualify.

Head Start incorporates a total family program that includes nutrition, education, medical and dental services for the enrolled child and home visitations. USDA approved meals are served. Training on various subjects and on-the-job training is offered to all enrolled families. Limited transportation may be available.

The 4-H Aplet Family Scholarship is awarded each year to one Columbia County student to pursue a degree at Oregon State University. Students may attend the OSU Corvallis Campus, Cascades Campus, or local community college through the OSU Dual Degree Program.

Scholarship applicants must have participated in the Columbia County 4-H Youth Development program. Preference will be given to applicants who will be majoring in business, finance, or a closely related field. This is a multi-year scholarship of \$1,250 per year for up to 4 years (\$5,000 total award).
