You probably have already heard that there will be some changes next year due to the budget shortfall. We presented a balanced budget to the District Budget Committee last week, but in doing so are proposing the following changes:

• The entire district will take five (5) Furlough Days where every staff member in the district will not report to work. Two of these days will be scheduled to allow them to be used to replace snow days if needed.

• We will eliminate 2.2 Full Time Equivalent (FTE) licensed positions (one due to a resignation); 2.4 FTE classified positions, primarily due to changing demands at the new school building; and over \$10,000 in administrative costs.

• We will no longer be able to provide funding for middle school sports.

I would point out that this is the proposed budget and is subject to change since we continue to get more accurate information on federal funding and other funding opportunities. We will be discussing the budget in detail at the next Budget Committee meeting, scheduled for Thursday, May 24, at 6:00 p.m., where the public is welcome. If you have suggestions or concerns please let me know by May 21st so we can research the feasibility of any proposed changes.

CCRider Student Fun Passes now on sale

Transportation has announced that the 2012 Student Summer Fun Pass is now available for eligible students. The pass is good for all zones and routes,

Columbia County Rider and allows students to travel locally and regionally on the CCRider system. The \$45.00 pass is valid from June 7 through September 4.

To be eligible for the pass,

students must be enrolled in Columbia County schools, attending grades 1-12 in the upcoming school year. Some extra paper work is required for students under the age of 12 in order to insure the safety of those riders.

School board expects cuts to make budget work

The Vernonia School Board meeting of May 10 was preceded by the first budget meeting for the 2012-13 fiscal year.

The budget message stated that due to lower student count, relatively flat funding from the state, significant increases in transportation costs, contractual salary increases and other factors, the budget is being balanced by reducing days of school and making staffing cuts.

The district is proposing five furlough days and the elimination of 2.2 full time licensed positions (one resigned and the position will not be filled), and 2.4 classified positions; there will also be \$10,000 cut from administrative costs. The classified position cuts are considered to be "due to changing demands at the new school building". Budget committee meetings are scheduled to continue through May 24, so some of these proposals may be modified before the budget's final approval by the board of directors.

When the regular board meeting started, High School Principal Nate Underwood announced that 100 percent of the seniors passed their reading tests. The board also heard about recent happenings at the middle school and high school levels in reports given by leadership students.

Steve Effros, the school construction project manager, told the board about a big volunteer planting effort at the new school that will include PCC students, contractors and the board, and will take place on June 1 at the new school.

High school graduation ceremonies will take place June 2, while eighth grade promotion will be held June 6.

In other business, the board: · accepted the resignation of high school language arts teacher Frica Bell:

· approved 24 revised policies:

• approved a supplemental budget moving more money into food service for the current fiscal year;

· declared a list of items as surplus. These items will be included in the surplus sale scheduled for May 22 (see Chalk Talk on this page for more details).

The next regular meeting of the board of directors will take place on June 14, starting at 6:00 p.m., at the district office.
