EPA awards \$200k for Vernonia Brownfield cleanup

SEATTLE - State and local governments in Oregon will receive over \$2.1 million in EPA Brownfields funding to help breathe new life into contaminated properties and revitalize former industrial sites.

EPA Brownfields Grants fund site assessments and site cleanups, supporting local efforts to clean up contamination or otherwise make land useable for housing, community space or commercial development. EPA also provides often cash-strapped communities a much-needed boost to bring abandoned lands back into productive use.

City of Vernonia will receive a \$200,000 Community-wide Assessment grant which will be used to inventory Brownfield sites throughout the city, perform environmental site assessments, and conduct community outreach. Contact:

City of Eugene will receive a \$680,200 Brownfields Assessment Coalition grant that will be used to establish a coalition with the City of Springfield and Lane County to develop a Brownfields inventory and conduct environmental site assessments within their three ju-

Northeast Oregon Economic Development District will receive a \$400,000 Communitywide Assessment Grant to inventory and prioritize brownfield sites and conduct environmental site assessments on properties located throughout Baker, Union, and Wallowa Counties in northeastern Oregon. This project will include community outreach cleanup planning activities.

City of Troutdale will receive a \$200,000 grant to perform an environmental site assessment and conduct community outreach and cleanup planning activities at the Troutdale Riverfront Redevelopment property at 302 NW 257th Way. The site, which sits on the bank of the Sandy River, operated as a slaughterhouse and rendering plant from 1901 to the late 1960s.

Job hunt harder for older workers

PENDLETON, Ore. - A new report from the General Accounting Office (GAO) focuses on the challenges of job-hunting for people over age 55, and how longer periods of unemployment and lower wages upon re-employment affect older workers' retirement security.

Its findings aren't surprising to Scot Jacobsen, who directs the Pendleton-based Senior Community Service Employment Program for Morrow and Umatilla counties. He says part of his job is to help rebuild the confidence of older workers who have been discouraged by their job-hunt, "They feel worthless. It's interesting, because when we go back over their resumes, they're very impressive. A lot of times, they forget all the good things they've done over the years. We take those skills, try to sharpen 'em up and send 'em back out

Companies are reluctant to hire people over 55, the report says, because employers assume their health insurance costs will rise and that older See Hunt on page 17

Jobs rate stays flat in county

Columbia County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 9.4 percent in April, essentially unchanged from the previous month (9.3%), but lower than the year before (10.4%). The rate was higher than the statewide rate (8.5%) and the national rate (8.1%). Total employment rose by 121 to 22,529 and the number of unemployed people fell by 194 to 2,349. Total employment this April was 260 more than one year before and there were 151 fewer people unemployed this year.
