

School board approves bid for new benches

The Vernonia School Board held a special meeting on June 21, with three items on the agenda.

The board approved a supplemental budget, as required by state law, that was necessitated by a larger fund balance and more state timber revenues than expected. As a result, \$532,265 was temporarily transferred to the Capital Reserve Construction Fund.

While the board was there for the supplemental budget, they also awarded a contract for almost \$11,000 to Fall Creek Woodworking to build

benches from trees cut on the site of the new school. Benches from this project will be used inside and outside.

The final business for the board was a list of items to declare as surplus so the district can dispose of two phone systems, the high school gymnasium bleachers, a commercial washer and dryer, lockers from the cafeteria building and from the grade school boys' locker room, six wall clocks, miscellaneous TVs and VCRs and an air scrubber from Washington Grade School.
