#### Governor sets up new Task Force

Governor Kitzhaber has signed an Executive Order establishing a new Oregon Domestic Violence Prevention and Response Task Force. The group will be formed over the next two months and begin meeting in September.

"Despite efforts around the state devoted to preventing domestic violence and supporting victims of abuse, Oregon continues to see an increase in domestic violence, putting too many people at risk," said Governor Kitzhaber. "The effect on individuals and children is a tragedy, while the overall impact on communities is profound and unacceptable."

The effects of domestic violence include personal injury, homelessness, lost work time and productivity, alcohol and other drug abuse, increased health care costs, adverse impacts on children, and denial of

#### 24 Years Ago This Month

The July 28, 1988, issue of *The Independent* included the following news story on page 16:

As many Vernonia area residents are signing petitions asking the state Highway Division to straighten two dangerous curves on Highway 47, another accident occurred, July 12, at the bridge crossing the Nehalem River .9 miles south of town.

Lorna Mae DuPuis, 19, of Vancouver, Washington, received multiple lacerations and a fractured wrist when her southbound 1971 Mercury Capris crossed over the center line into the path of a north-bound 1977 Dodge pickup.

DuPuis was transported to Oregon Health Sciences University Hospital by Vernonia ambulance and Life Flight, after she was finally extricated from her mangled auto by members of the Vernonia Fire Department. DuPuis was released from OHSU Hospital on July 16.

The driver of the pickup, David W. Kolko, 32, of Rio Vista, California, was uninjured. His passenger, David Frost, 30, of Vernonia, was treated for minor injuries and released from St. Vincent Hospital.

At the time of the bridge's construction, the north end was aligned with the roadway. The south end was designed to connect with a straight road, but the necessary roadwork was never done resulting in narrow, sharp "S" curve between two stretches of straight highway.

Larry Bernardi, of Vernonia, has spearheaded a drive aimed at getting the road straightened. The City of Vernonia, Vernonia Area Chamber of Commerce, Vernonia Chapter of Associated Loggers, and the local unit of Oregon Forest Products Transportation Association have all endorsed the road straightening.

The 4th of July has come and gone, T.V. says it's going to be HOT for 9 days - time will tell.


