The Criminal Libel Case May Begin by November 1st. Catholics Ridicule Their Victim and Claim the First Victory.

Word comes from Attorney Winslow that the time for the trial of the editor of this paper on a charge of criminal libel, was not set last Saturday, as expected, owing to some technicality, but that the prospects are good to have the time set tomorrow. He says that the indications are that the criminal libel case will begin November 1st, but a victim, when he becomes entangled in the awful meshes of the law, never can tell just when his turn will come to be slaughtered.
