We are appointing a vice pres-

ident from each state and want

a corresponding secretary in each

community. We make the call

for volunteers to take this duty

The constitution of the American

Federation of Patriotic Voters

is as concise as was possible

to make it, thus relieving our-

selves of all dead weight and en-

abling our friends to easily or-

ganize local communities without

conflicting with existing organi-

zations.

NAME.—The name of this or-

ganization shall be the American

Federation of Patriotic Voters.

OBJECT.—The object of this

organization shall be the federa-

tion of all patriotic organizations

and individuals who believe in the

principles hereinafter set forth

in the platform this day unani-

mously adopted.

ORGANIZATION.—The officers

of this organization shall consist

of a President, a Vice President,

a Secretary and Treasurer, whose

duties shall be those which usu-

ally are performed by such

officers. In addition, there shall

be an executive committee con-

sisting of nine members elected

by this organization, the afore-

mentioned officers being mem-

bers ex-officio of this committee.

TIME OF MEETING.—This or-

ganization shall meet annually as

determined by the committee.

MEMBERSHIP.—The delegates
to this annual meeting shall be
charter members of this organi-

zation.
Every patriotic organization
shall be entitled to two delegates
for representation at the annual
meeting.

AMENDMENTS.—This constitu-
tion shall be amended by a two-
thirds vote of the delegates pres-
ent.

OUR PLATFORM.

Our platform embodies those
principles which make for the
welfare of our nation and the
protection of those institutions
through which we have become
the leading nation of the earth.
No true American can object to
subscribing to them and doing
all he can to disseminate these
principles.

PLATFORM.

1. We demand absolute separa-
tion of church and state, as
guaranteed in the constitution.

2. That the public schools are
essential to the safety of the
state; that such schools should
be free from ecclesiastical influ-
ence or control; that the persons
disloyal to the government or to
the public schools should be rig-
orously excluded from teaching
therein.

3. That freedom of speech
and of the press be preserved in-
violable.

4. That there shall be no divi-
sion of public property or funds
for sectarian purposes whatso-
ever.

5. That there shall be full reli-
gious toleration under the
American flag.

6. We demand stronger safe-
guards against the admission of
undesirable immigrants, by suffi-
cient tests as to the literacy,
health and morals.

7. We urge an amendment to
the constitution so that subjects
of foreign powers shall be de-
nied election franchise.
