The only form of religious worship to which, from the seventh to the sixteenth century, Europeans had free access, was the form prescribed by Rome. Here and there were persons who, born as Romanists, had learned something better, but seeking to practice it, Rome persecuted them to the death. The "History" of those times tells little about these people, but thank God, the "Religion of Protestants" is entirely different from the pretended "Christianity" of Rome, as practiced during these ages and since.
