A WOMAN POPE

Who has not heard that once, during the Dark Ages, a woman held the office of Pope of Rome? The date assigned to the woman

pope is the middle of the ninth century-about the year 855. During the 450 years following, to the birth of Wickliffe, the church of Rome had, as shown by the Migne Library, .. bout one hundred writers whose productions are known. These men wrote on all serts of subjects, not many of them on history. And, take notice, all of these writers, historians and others, were censored by the prelates in charge; so that while the truth of the statements male is not proved, it is proved that the censors thought the writings they passed, would not wrong the church of Rome. Now it is from writings so censored that we learn of the woman pope. In time the story was disputed. But a writer in the Catholic World takes the lead in ev. sion that does not succeed in evading, and denial that confesses. He proves anow that once in a while, a Roman prelate or controversialist may inadvertantly tell a part of the truth. He guardidly suggests that since there were, in those times, in Roman politics, a hera of monstrous women, Theodora, Marozia, and others, some one may an was pope, rather than say that the man pope was ruled by a woman. But what does this imply? He does not tell us that one of the women he names, Marozia, was mistress of three popes, one of whom was her own son. Sergius III was first, and their son was made pope, as John XI, and she became mistress of this pope. She was also mistress of another of her own sons, Alberick, and their son became pope John XII.

Yes, some women ruled some popes in ways that were very dark. That which the writer in the "World" suggests so guardidly, is really more to the discredit of Rome than the story that a woman held the office of pope. For, as the story of the woman pope goes, she ruled wisely and justly, and might have held the office long, but that she was betrayed and became a mother.

If Rome would concede that her popes and prelates were human beings, no worse than others of their times, even if no better, they might put up a better case. But that would be death to the notion of infallibility; and t give up this, would concede to the laity that the priesthood does not stand in the place of God. Who is the only Infallible One. The case is before you.. Some Romanist writers say that there was never a woman pope, others, as truthful, so far as we know, say there was such a pope. And there you are! Deside for your
