#### AMERICA'S MENACE

Times almost without number we have heard it innocently but ignorantly said that the Papal Hierarchy was such a wonderful philanthropic institution, with open arms reaching out in every direction indicative of loving sympathy for the unfortunate and distressed—which may be true, but like the wolf loves the lamb.
