

Cutting Out Fruit Trees.

- 1. If trees from a distance are partly dry when received bury them for a week, top and all, in finely pulverized, moist soil to restore them.
2. Before setting out dig holes broad enough to receive all the roots without bending.
3. Use no manure, except on the surface, after setting or in the remote parts of large holes.
4. In setting out, spread the roots out equally on all sides at their full length, and fill in compactly fine, mellow earth.
5. After set, shorten back the long shoots, and thin out where too thick, giving a neat, even, moderate head.
6. Always shorten back before the buds swell, and never when partly or wholly in leaf.
7. Keep the ground for several feet around the newly set trees clean and mellow all summer.—Country Gentleman.
