**A COMPARISON.**

Tillamook county is as large as the State of Delaware. This county has more productive lands, more resources in the way of timber, coal etc., as much coast line, more and better harbors, many more rivers, and a climate that is far ahead of that in the little "Blue Hen State." Yet the State of Delaware has a population of 175,000 with a city larger than Portland, while Tillamook county, in every way able to support as many people, has a population of only a little over 3,000. Of course, Delaware has been settled longer, and is nearer the center of population, which accounts for the great difference in the development and population. The city of Wilmington, Delaware, has a great many manufactures, which accounts for its size. But the west is being developed rapidly and in a few years we will see thickly populated communities and large cities where there are only a few people at present. And as far as manufacturing is concerned, this county has great advantages in the way of raw material and excellent water power.

While these western localities are growing so rapidly, the people are sure to be prosperous, and Tillamook county offers to-day as great inducements to men with capital and brains as any place in the United States.

What this county most needs now, is to have its advantages and resources made known to the world. A large immigration is sure to come in that case, and the convenience of life in the way of shipping and transportation facilities will soon follow.

**RAFTING LOGS BY SEA.**

A curiosity that is causing the close attention of nautical men at present is the huge-raft brought down by the Noyo from Noyo. The Noyo arrived in San Francisco late Thursday night in command of Captain Drisko, four days from Noyo, and having in tow no less than two million feet of lumber. The enormous size of this raft can be judged when it would take at least eight schooners carrying 200,000 feet each to bring down this load in an ordinary manner.—Press Dispatch.

It is possible that the timber of Tillamook county, or a part of it, will be taken to San Francisco in this manner yet.

"Buried at sea!" Why? In olden times there were valid reasons for burial at sea. Sails had not been superseded by steam, sailors were superstitious, voyages were long. The census of 1880 gave Tillamook county a population of 1589. The estimated census based on the latest returns for 1890 shows a population of 2900, or nearly double. We think however the last estimate was made before South Prairie precinct was counted, and the final count will probably show that the population of the county has more than doubled in the last ten years. Most of the increase was made in the last two years however, and there was never a time in the history of the county when it was as prosperous as now. At the present rate of increase it will not be long until the population is again doubled.

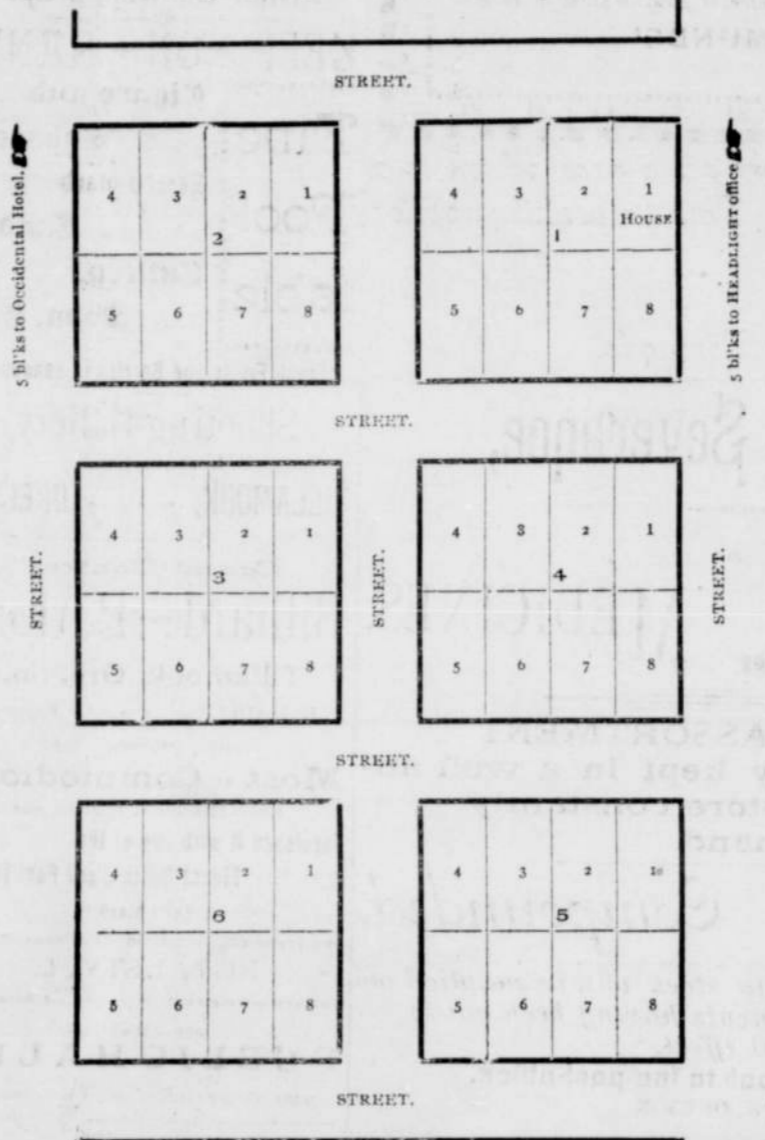
