E. E. Selph came to this county several years ago and opened a law office. At the time it seemed as if Tillamook county were well supplied with lawyers, but Mr. Selph opened an office and started to practice. In a short time he secured a good practice, and being honorable and conscientious in his dealings with everyone, he soon acquired a very large practice, often attending to cases in the supreme court. He never encouraged litigation, in fact, discouraged his clients from going into expensive lawsuits when it would have been money in his pocket otherwise. Mr. Selph was formerly a Yamhill county man, and from what we can hear from that county he stands high in the estimation of the people there, and will receive a rousing vote in that county.

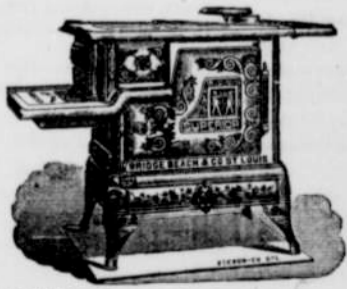
