A. P. WILSON'S OPINION.

Editor HEADLIGHT:—In your last issue you say that you would be pleased for some man to state his objection to your political policy over his own signature which I will endeavor to do briefly by expressing my own convictions. While I hold that every man is a free moral agent with a constitutional right to cast his vote as he sees fit, I also claim that no man has a moral right to vote against his political conviction to gain some local change or relief that would only afflict a few hundred people, when by so doing he is helping to bring calamity and distress not only upon himself but upon sixty-five million people as well. A man's political principles should be broader than the little precinct, county or state, in which he lives, they should be so broad that they will cover the welfare of the whole nation. What Tillamook County wants now in a Joint Representative is a man that will vote for Hon. J. N. Dolph or Hon. C. W. Fulton for U. S. Senator. Now a vote cast for Mr. Selph is a vote cast against against those gentlemen and for Mr. Pennoyer or some other man equally antagonistic to our welfare.

Tillamook County can much better afford to be misrepresented by a Yamhill man, than that she should have a Democrat or Populist Senator to look after her wants in congress.

But I do not believe that Mr. Guild will misrepresent us. If we only let him know what we want, and show him the justice of our

claim for a representative for Tillamook county that he will do his best to get a reapportionment of representatives, or get the law so changed that Yamhill County will only be allowed her proportion of delegates to the state convention to vote for Joint Representative which would be Yamhill 2 and Tillamook 4, in which event we could nominate a Tillamook man.

I have carefully read Mr. Lamb's communication in your last issue and while I think the theory of his deductions are true yet I am not sanguine of success as to allow myself to miss an opportunity to secure a vote for Mr. Guild and I think that all true Republicans if they will but give the matter a thought will feel the same way, and I appeal to all voters of Tillamook County as you love your homes, and the property of the nation to lay your prejudices aside and to do all in your power to wrest the control of the Government from the party who have brought bankruptcy, disaster and ruin upon us.

As to your policy in local or county politics, in justice to yourself and the Republicans who believe in honest politics, I don't see how you could take a different course except in the case of judgeship, for if rumor is correct there is an understanding between the candidate for county judge on the democratic ticket and the father of the candidate for county clerk on the Republican ticket, whereby an old debt was to be paid off, by mutually working for each other. And color is given to the rumor by the appearance of two men at Nehalem, who both claimed to be working for Conder and Mills and they spent money very freely in the saloon there.

I was informed by a gentleman in Tillamook that he had received a letter from Salem a few days since from a friend who claimed that Mr. Mills had had a continuous residence in Salem for over three years.
