Like the balance of the state Lincoln county is republican. Hermann received 150 plurality, and the balance of the state ticket varies from 70 to 100. The populists elected their treasurer; the democrats, clerk and assessor and the republicans the balance of their ticket. Frank Stanton, republican nominee for sheriff, was elected by only a small majority. The vote on the county seat did not settle the vexed question permanently, and for two years more at least, Toledo will content to be the capital. The vote was as follows: West Yaquina, 336; Toledo, 270; Newport, 178; Elk City, 44. A majority of all votes cast is necessary for a choice, and at the election two years hence Toledo and West Yaquina will be the only contestants, as it was agreed that only the two receiving highest votes should be entitled to compete again.

The result of election caused some of our citizens to become hilarious and some otherwise. Some imbibed tarantula juice and some laughing gas, but it must have been a curious mixture which caused our usually good natured marshal to forget himself and exchange political views so forcibly. Doug. Bryan expostulated with him and others dropped in until it resulted in T. B. Nelson slapping Jimmy Ferguson.
